Staffordshire/Shropshire --numerous postcodes (this is following the recent resignation of long-serving RC lan, many thanks mate for your enthusiasm and good service!)


In the meantime the RC work for these Regions will be done by us, but really it needs people living in those areas to take on the jobs. Please contact us at the addresses below if you want to help.

District Managers Report - Beltane 2018

Hello,

For this re-launch of our District Magazine 'Myddle Earth', may we extend a warm welcome to our new editor Ailim, and new members across the District. Thanks also to all who have renewed. It's great to have you with us!

Some of you are new to Paganism and the PF while others have been involved (in either and in some cases both) for many years, even decades. Whatever your path/faith/belief, or however you define it, we are united around a common purpose: asserting our rights, celebrating our variety and supporting one another in the many strands that make up Paganism.

The Pagan Federation Constitution declares that no path has seniority over another, all are considered equal and worthy of respect and support. Don't feel that you have any less of a 'claim' to be Pagan if you are just beginning in your discovery, or don't have any training in a tradition, or prefer to let your spirit guide you. We can learn from each other, whatever level we are at. As in all areas of life, everyone was a newcomer at one time, taking those first steps on a path. PF membership includes a wide range such as Druids, Heathens, Traditional and Eclectic Witches, Shamans, Wiccans, or folks who simply call themselves Pagans.

We refer you to this clause from the PF Code of Conduct, "Spiritual Tolerance":

Spiritual tolerance:

The PF recognises that there are many traditions under the umbrella of the term "paganism". We hold that no single religion can be described as a "One True Faith" for all peoples. Members of the PF are encouraged to share their beliefs and practices, and to learn about the beliefs and practices of other members. No one tradition will be promoted above any other. Members found to be promoting, whether verbally or in writing, any spiritual tradition as the "Only True" tradition will be subject to the disciplinary procedure.

So there you have it, the PF is an equal-opportunity organisation.

THE PLASTIC PERIL

Pagan's are eco-friendly and, where possible, try and live in a way that minimises harm to the natural environment. If we all work together towards being sustainable in our own lives, then the Earth will be a better place for all. If we don't, then we are condemning our future generations to living with the pollution we have created. Plastic pollution is perhaps one of the greatest threats to life on our planet. Land and marine ecosystems with thousands of animals choking on plastic materials. Plastic waste also affects their habitats so we are, in fact, polluting our own environment, especially as plastic residue i.e. micro beads can find its way back into our food chain.

Pagan's revere the natural habitat and wildlife. We know trees are the lungs of our planet. Each time a forest or wood is chopped down, our Mother Earth will take longer to recover from the environmental damage we are causing.

Yet, how can we live without plastic? If we go back to using more paper products, more trees will be cut down. Plastic does have its uses and can be beneficial if used in a responsible way and discarded in the correct manner.

We can help by not using plastic straws, cotton buds and single use drink bottles, but I find most of my plastic waste comes from packaging. I recently received the *National Trust* magazine in a "plastic" see-thru cover—it felt like plastic and looked like plastic—but it was made from potato starch! All their issues now come in a biodegradable wrap that can be placed in our compost bins. If only more manufacturers and supermarkets went down the "plants, not plastic" route, perhaps we could start to turn the tide against plastic waste.

- We reserve the right to abridge articles and to edit them for clarity, style, grammar and accuracy.
