As we welcome Spring and see the return of new green life to the Earth, take an opportunity on the first warm day to open the windows wide, allowing fresh air and sunshine into your home.



Notes from Ceridwen's Womb

Standing to Attention By Laurence Main

Roaming through the countryside, we inevitably come across monuments and follies. They pierce the horizon, catching the eye as phallic erections in a Goddess landscape of rounded hills and inviting valleys. Each has a story to tell. They mark leys. Somebody knew to put them at particular spots.

The 'cannon barrel' on Pen Dinas above Aberystwyth was erected in 1852 in memory of the Duke of Wellington, victor of Waterloo. It was intended to erect a statue of the Duke on horseback on top of the monument, but the funds didn't run to this. No matter, the leys are there in abundance (a good place to dowse, with a wide view). It is set within an ancient hill fort known in *The Welsh Triads* as *Allt Vaellwr*:

"And in the land of Aber Teivi there was in former times before Brutus came to this island the Giant Maylor, and the place where he lived is still called Castell Maylor, built upon a high hill or ridge which is called Y Dinas, beside the river Ystwyth, within the freehold of the town of Aberystwyth."

The ancient settlement was here, beside the Ystwyth. The modern town should really be called Aber-Rheidol.

I can't resist a poetic interlude! The poet Swinburne was once challenged in an Aberystwyth pub to come up with a rhyme

for the town. Here are his words:

"There once was a girl from Aberystwyth Who took grain to the mill to make grist with. The miller's son Jack laid her flat on her back And united the organs they pissed with."

Wayfarers along the Offa's Dyke Path, and the Severn Way, walk under the shadow of the Breiddens near Welshpool. These hills happen to form the shape of a landscape Goddess whose head is in the south. At a prominent summit at 1200 feet is Admiral Rodney's Pillar, erected in 1781 commemorate his naval victory in the French Wars. A ley runs in the direction of the Summer Solstice sunset (or, in reverse, the Winter Solstice sunrise) from this pillar to Pistyll Rhaeadr, the waterfall which veils the vulva of the landscape Goddess and leads to a stone row and stone circle at \$J058302 (the navel of the pregnant belly of the landscape Goddess of the Berwyn range?). Look along this stone row, southwards, and there's Rodney's Pillar on the horizon. Obviously providing the phallic element to fertilising of the living land at the Solstice(s).

Come to the Ley Hunters' Moot in Oxfordshire this May (telephone me on 01650 531354

in good time). I'll be leading a free walk to Blenheim Palace where, on 30th November, 1874, Sir Winston Churchill, a descendant of the great Duke of Marlborough, was born.

Blenheim Palace is on what I call Churchill's Warrior Ley. This links the Column of Victory in Blenheim Great Park with Churchill's birthplace in Blenheim Palace and St Martin's Church, Bladon, where our great leader during the Second World War was buried on 30th January, 1965, after his state funeral in St Paul's Cathedral. There are other features on this ley but just let this simple fact sink in: our greatest warrior, who was also a Druid (and I've met a Druid who worked actively in spirit for Churchill, at his request, during the war) was born and buried on a ley running through the Column of Victory.

This ley runs along the axial line actually **intended** by Vanbrugh, the architect of Blenheim. The Column of Victory commemorates the first Duke of Marlborough's victory over the French at the Battle of Blenheim in 1704. It was completed in 1730. But isn't this marking much more than a battle? Aren't energies being harnessed here for a much greater, future, victory? The Spirit of Our Land flowed through Churchill. He was our Man of Destiny. And the Column was erected with intent 144 years before his birth. As it happens, this Churchill's Warrior Ley can be extended to the venue of the Network of Ley Hunters' Moot to be held in Oxford on Saturday, 21st May (the guided walk will be on Tuesday, 24th May). There's a campsite nearby, so see you there! Telephone: 01650 531354.

with a perceptive intelligence and a marvellous sense of humour. Together we organised conferences in the District, went on camping weekends and attended one-day Pagan events. Pat and her brother, Nicholas, twice came to stay with us on our narrow boat and we parked our motor home on her drive.

She was timeless in her freewheeling, poised eccentricity.

Like many of her generation she had been a lady with a career, in her case academic administration. For those who don't know, departmental secretaries rule the roost in universities. Pat became a home owner, was a wonderful single parent and kept cats. Her long time partner Trevor, a university senior lecturer, predeceased

her by a couple of years. With a bequest from Trevor she had French windows and a conservatory installed, and was able to enjoy this beautiful space during the last year of her life.

When it was discovered that Pat's bowel cancer had returned in the autumn of last year, everyone who knew her was devastated. Audrey and I, along with family members and many friends, visited

Uranus, Neptune and Pluto

o get a far better understanding of these Planets than I can give, please get hold of a copy of Aleister

Crowley's book, "The Complete Astrological Writings" I was intending to

Writings". I was intending to refer to that book for this article, but unfortunately I can't find it, so you'll have to make do with my limited knowledge. Therefore, this may well be a somewhat shorter article than usual.

Ancient Astrology didn't know about these Planets so in a sense they are modern inventions and we have no old records to refer to. In fact, the scientific community doesn't even recognize Pluto as a Planet anymore, however Astrologers do.

As these more recent Planets have been discovered, it has been necessary to re-assign the Planetary rulers. Before March 13th, 1781, when Uranus was discovered, Saturn ruled Aquarius, but it is now ruled by Uranus. The keyword to describe the action of Uranus is 'Change' - often sudden,

disruptive and unexpected. In a way, its action could be likened to the Tarot card 'The Blasted Tower' or even 'Death'. This all sounds a bit alarming but remember change is the foundation of life. Without it we would become stale and stagnant. The only constant in life is change, and if you don't bring it about yourself, then Uranus will do it for you, whether you're ready for it or not.

Uranus is associated with physical changes, sexual perversion, paralysis, cramp, sudden nervous breakdown, modern science, aeronautics, radio and television, space


travel, and science fiction.

Its positive traits include being humanitarian, friendly, kind, independent, original, inventive, strong willed, versatile. and not liking restriction (due to it being outside the orbit of Saturn which rules restriction). On the other hand its negative traits include being cranky, eccentric, determined to be different, perverse, abnormal, and rebellious.

The position of Uranus in your chart is very important from the point of view of your interests. If it is prominent (in

either the 1st or 12th house or near your Sun or Moon), then you will be strongly concerned with all things of an occult nature and, if pursued, should flourish. Uranus is known as 'The Magician', where Neptune is 'The Mystic'. Since Uranus also holds sway over social

change, it also regulates the global brotherhood of man and all humanitarian concerns, including environmental issues. Uranus stays in a sign for about 7 years and while there, makes a similar impression on all those born during that period. On the collective level, it influences the cultural pulse of a given time period. That's all I canthink of to say about Uranus so onto Neptune.



Before September 23rd, 1846, when Neptune was discovered, Pisces was ruled by Jupiter, but it has now been assigned to Neptune due mainly to its nebulous qualities. It is a very slow moving Planet, taking about 14 - 20 years to pass through one sign of the Zodiac

(depending on retrograde motion). This being the case, it is more to do with generation types rather than individuals.

A fairly good example of this is the fact that between 1942 to 1956 Neptune was in Libra. As stated above, Neptune is 'The Mystic' and is concerned with all things spiritual. Its keyword is 'Cloudiness' and is strongly

associated with all things artistic and religious including poetry, music, dancing, and freedom. Drugs and poisons also come under its heading. Keep that in mind when I say that Libra is also concerned with freedom, balance, art, music, bright colours, mental exploration, and an easy going

nature. Plus, along with Pisces, it is said that Librans are also concerned with the higher aspects of religious experiment, often involving drugs to aid this process. Put these two things together and we find that those born between 1942 to 1956 went on to become the flower children of the late 1960's and early 1970's. If we move forward in time, Neptune then moves into Scorpio and we get the next generation who brought about the punk movement.

Neptune's glyph is the trident of Poseidon, God of the Seas. Much about this Planet is fluid (Neptune rules the oceans of the Earth), changeable, and illusory in nature. Dreams, illusion, abstract thought, and the mysterious are all governed by Neptune. Our spirituality is important to this Planet and how we

harness that energy for our personal betterment. Neptune is also the Planet of inspiration. The higher octave of Venus, Neptune brings beauty to a higher, more spiritual level. It also holds sway over dreams, the subconscious, illusions,


fantasies, and all things magical and enchanting. Neptune intensifies intuition and teaches us to be deeply compassionate. Neptune often asks us to sacrifice for the greater good or for love of another. A youthful and sometimes naive spirit characterizes those with a placement strong Neptune in their natal charts. It is also said that

the vibrations of Neptune are so sublime that only a few can raise their consciousness to its level of expression, for its dual nature causes it to be expressed in its highest only through the finest vehicles. Therefore, the mind and body must be pure and well under control before the higher and

psychical expression can be made manifest in the flesh. I think that will do for Neptune so onto Pluto.

Pluto is the smallest and furthest away from the Sun of all Planets. It is extremely slow moving, taking about 240 years to traverse the Zodiac and somewhere between 12 and 31 years to go through one sign of the Zodiac.

I find it curious that Pluto changed sign in both 1914 and 1939. I think those dates mean something to most people. Pluto governs power itself, including struggles between people and countries for domination and, of course, personal power. It changed signs again in 1984, then again in 2008, but isn't due to change again until 2024. It shows up when perfectly capable people end up under the thumb of someone else's control,





Facing down the control and manipulation of others, especially parents, can make us weak in the knees. But once we do this, we are changed forever. Pluto's energy may be subtle, but its results will hit you like a ton of bricks. This Planet is about

transformation, regeneration, and rebirth. Things aren't pretty with Pluto but they do get done. Pluto says 'out with the old and in with the new', and we'd better be ready for it. If we're not, this Planet will simply have us wallow in our misery. Pluto asks us to transcend that which we know, redeem ourselves in the process, and come out


stronger as a result. It loves to destroy. This Planet rules destruction, death, obsession, kidnapping, coercion, viruses, and waste. That's definitely not pretty. Pluto also governs crime and the underworld, along with many forms of subversive activity (terrorism, dictatorships). This Planet is about all that is secret

and undercover, that which is hidden from view.

Pluto was discovered on February 18th, 1930, and was assigned to Scorpio which was originally ruled by Mars. Its keyword is

'Elimination' which sounds auite alarming remember we can never have anything new until we eliminate the old, so it is also seen as the Planet o f rebirth o r transformation. This Planet covers many fundamental issues including life and death the ultimate transformation of energy. Pluto rules all that is hidden, unseen, or buried,

including secrets, undercover work (such as detective or spy work), strategic planning, and even the roots of plants or vegetables. It also drives the unearthing or unmasking of whatever has remained concealed. Pluto may bring an end to things that need to be let go of.





This could be a job, a relationship, or anything else that is dragging you down. It may not be easy to do, but you need to pick up the pieces and go on with your life. The psyche can't hold on to everything and remain healthy. While it is scary to let things go, it will be better in the long run. And with that slightly positive note, I'll end this section.

The Planetary positions for the next 3 months

The Sun is the easiest as it moves 1 degree a day which means it travels through a sign of the Zodiac each month (roughly, as our months are not true months which means Moonths). From now (20th March), the Sun is moving into Aries. Then on 19th April, the Sun moves into Taurus and a month later on 20th May, the Sun enters Gemini. A month later, at the Summer Solstice, it enters Cancer (20th June). Quite easy really.


Then it comes to **The Moon** which travels very fast compared to other Planets. In fact, the Moon moves about 12 times faster, traveling right round the Zodiac each month and spending about 2½ days in one sign. In brief, I'll give the Zodiac sign for each phase:

Full Moon on March 23rd at midday - 3 degrees Libra Last Quarter on March 31st at 3pm - 11 degrees Capricorn

New Moon on April 7th at 11am - 18 degrees Aries First Quarter on April 14th at 3am - 25 degrees Cancer Full Moon on April 22nd at 5am - 3 degrees Scorpio Last Quarter on April 30th at 3am - 11 degrees Aquarius

New Moon on May 6th at 7pm - 17 degrees Taurus First Quarter on May 13th at 5pm - 23 degrees Leo Full Moon on May 21st at 9pm - 1 degree Sagittarius Last Quarter on May 29th at midday - 9 degrees Pisces

New Moon on June 5th at 3am - 15 degrees Gemini First Quarter on June 12th at 8am - 22 degrees Virgo Full Moon on June 20th at 11am - at the very end of Sagittarius.



Mercury at present is moving from Pisces to Aries. Mercury is moving very fast and goes right through Aries in 2 weeks, entering Taurus on 5th April. On 29th April, when Mercury is 23 degrees into Taurus, it goes retrograde and travels back to 14th degrees on 23rd May, when it returns to forward motion. Mercury finally leaves Taurus on 12th June and enters Gemini. At the Solstice, Mercury is 12 degrees into Gemini.

Venus comes next and at present is 10 degrees Pisces. It gets to the end of that sign on 5th April to enter Aries. Venus is also traveling quite fast and reaches the end of Aries on 30th April. From there it enters Taurus reaching the end of that sign on 24th May. It now enters Gemini and stays in that sign until 18th June. Consequently, it stands at 3 degrees Cancer at the Summer Solstice.

Mars is near the start of Sagittarius at present but only gets to 8 degrees on 18th April, when it turns retrograde and moves back into Scorpio on 28th May. Continuing its retrograde motion, Mars is situated 24 degrees into Scorpio at the Summer Solstice.

Jupiter is situated 16 degrees into Virgo at present but moving backwards. It continues moving backwards all through April and finally starts going forward on 10th May, when

it's at 13 degrees of Virgo. At the Summer Solstice, Jupiter is half way through Virgo.

Saturn is 16 degrees Sagittarius now but starts retrograde motion on 25th March. Saturn continues going backwards for the entire 3 months and reaches 11 degrees by the Summer Solstice.

Uranus is 19 degrees into Aries as you read this and moving very slowly. By the Summer Solstice, it is almost 24 degrees into that sign.

Neptune starts this period at 10 degrees into Pisces and also moves slowly. Just before Mid-summer, Neptune goes retrograde when it's at 14 degrees and is still in the same position at Mid-summer.

Pluto is the slowest of them all and is situated 17 degrees into Capricorn at the Spring Equinox. It then goes backwards from 15th April. It continues its backwards motion until well after mid-summer, when it has only gone back one degree.

Well, that's all folks.


